

## Cost Information Worksheet

This worksheet is intended to be used as a tool to help you estimate your balance for the **2011-2012** school year. Please contact your Student Account Manager for assistance enrolling in your payment plan or visit [www.fresno.edu/paymentplan](http://www.fresno.edu/paymentplan).

### How to use the cost information worksheet:

- Please review the “Cost and Financial Aid” section of the Fresno Pacific University catalog. Be sure you understand the costs, refund policies, and financial aid policies. Details can be found at [http://www.fresno.edu/dept/registrar/Pages/univ\\_catalog.htm](http://www.fresno.edu/dept/registrar/Pages/univ_catalog.htm).
- Carefully review the worksheet and circle or write the tuition and fees that apply to your situation. Review the “Additional Potential Fees” listed on the worksheet. If any apply to you, add the appropriate fee(s) to your costs for the semester. Be sure to note if the fees are per semester, per unit, or per class.

#### Important Health Insurance Information:

Every student attending FPU must have proof of health insurance coverage whether you are going to waive the school’s insurance or purchase it. Students who do not submit a waiver online **will be charged** for school sponsored health insurance. **School sponsored health insurance is non-refundable after the second week of classes.**

#### Important Housing & Board Information:

Housing assignment is dependent upon academic level (Freshman, Sophomore, etc.) and availability. All Freshman and Sophomores living in modules and suites are required to have the Full Access meal plan. All Juniors living in suites are required to have the 70 Block meal plan. All students living in the houses and apartments may opt to add a meal plan.

- Add all applicable charges to determine your total estimated cost (Section A)
- Add your total state and federal grants, FPU scholarships, Stafford loans and any outside or additional aid you expect to receive or plan to accept (Section B)
- In Section C, indicate your total charges less your total financial aid. This will help you determine your estimated remaining balance due.

### PAYMENT PLAN GUIDELINES & OPTIONS:

A 20-percent down payment is due by August 10 for fall and January 3 for spring. The remaining balance is due in four equal, interest free, monthly payments:

- Fall: Aug 10<sup>th</sup> 20%: 4 remaining payments: September 1, October 1, November 1, December 1
- Spring: Jan. 3<sup>rd</sup> 20%: 4 remaining payments: February 1, March 1, April 1, May 1

Students who will be covering their expenses (tuition, fees, room and board, etc.) with loans, scholarships, or grants must have all required financial aid paperwork turned in and loans approved before August 10 to avoid making the down payment. If 20% is not made or financial aid paperwork submitted by Aug. 10<sup>th</sup>, student will be un-enrolled from their fall semester courses.

Your monthly payment will reflect the total balance remaining after subtracting out any pending gift aid and approved loans. Because the account balance can change from month to month, it is your responsibility to check your account online on a regular basis at [www.fresno.edu/paymentplan](http://www.fresno.edu/paymentplan) or contact Student Financial Services at (559) 453-2041 if you have any questions regarding your student account.

#### Pay-in-Full Option:

Students may pay the semester balance in full. Payment is due by the end of the first week of each term or the student will be administratively enrolled in a semester payment plan with a \$50 Administrative Enrollment Fee assessed to the account.
