Program Notes

Tessellation is the name of Cerro Negro's latest recording. It is a reference to the idea of repeating patterns that use the efficiency of lines and space for maximum visual appeal. Tessellations are a form of geometry that adheres to the principles of economy, variation, and cooperation. Cerro Negro fuses these principles taking the interaction of three different elements to fill the space of their cosmopolitan tapestry. Esoteric musical elements are blended together following the ancient traditions bringing these sounds into the 21st century.

Tessellations is a reflection of the many styles and influences that make the diverse sound of Cerro Negro. We have always been a part of this complex human tapestry that is made up of so many cultural influences. Growing up in the state of California has given this group of performers the unique perspectives pieced together here tonight. Biographies

John Martin III grew up in Central California and was exposed to the music and sounds of many cultures. He was raised in Fine Arts schools and started playing music in the fourth grade. His musical journey is rooted in his love of Jazz and Latin Music. He played drums and percussion professionally from almost the time he started. He has a degree in Percussion Performance and Jazz Studies. His professional experience is vast and diverse finding him with artists from Mel Torme to Macy Gray most recently playing timbales for Soneros del Valle. John plays all forms of hand, stick, and mallet percussion. Currently when not touring. John now specializes in Flamenco and world percussion. His style and perspective come from a place of openness and fluidity merging his understanding of "total percussion."

Frank Giordano started his musical adventure on the piano. It wasn't until his college years that Frank discovered the guitar and started to play. He attended Fresno State University where he was exposed to Flamenco Master Juan Serrano. Through the influence of the Maestro and his students, Frank came to have a love for the Flamenco guitar. He soon joined forces with his roommates and started a band called Cerro Negro. As his experience grew through years of touring and traveling the country, he has expanded his playing to once again include the piano as well as new instruments such as the Turkish "cumbus" and the Cuban "Tres." He is an accomplished accompanist in many styles including Flamenco, Jazz, and Brazilian music.

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
