Advanced In-Depth Clinical Training prepares you for licensure as a clinical social worker (L.C.S.W.) and allows you to provide therapy and mental health services. Licensure is typically required for independent practice and clinical roles.

Advocacy and Social Justice: Tools for advocating for marginalized and underserved populations and influencing policy.

- Leadership Development and Skill-building, including effective communication, strategic thinking, decision-making and team management.

- Career Versatility in a variety of settings, including schools, hospitals, mental health clinics, non-profit organizations, government agencies and private practice. Social workers can specialize in areas such as clinical practice, social policy, community organizing and more.

- Field internship in an advanced practice setting, supervised by a skilled practitioner in the social work profession.
- Study under experienced and highly rated university faculty.
- Progress through coursework in a cohort format.

- On-site: Classes meet two evenings per week.
 - Offered at FPU's Southeast Fresno Campus, North Fresno Campus and Visalia Campus.
- Candidates with advanced standing may be eligible to complete the program in one year.

Advanced Standing

Applicants who have graduated from a Council on Social Work Education (C.S.W.E.) Bachelor of Social Work (B.S.W.) accredited program may be eligible to begin the M.S.W. program in year two of the curriculum. To be considered, you must have completed a verified 400+ hour internship and submit verification of the field internship hours and of your B.S.W. final field evaluation.
