The Liberal Studies ITEP pathway is an accelerated pathway to earn your education specialist teaching credential. Education Specialist Credential students will have two pathway options: mild to moderate support needs or extensive support needs. New or transfer students can take at least one year off the current traditional route. FPU's credential programs are accredited by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC, www.ctc.ca.gov).
