

To be considered for admission to the Master of Divinity program, please submit the following:



Official college/university transcript(s) verifying receipt of a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution and any post-baccalaureate work.

- If you are currently finishing up your degree, please submit current transcripts.
 - A final transcript must be submitted before you enroll in classes.

If your cumulative GPA for your bachelor's degree is below a 2.5 GPA (4.0 scale), a letter of explanation is required.

Reference Forms: Two references are required for the Master of Divinity program. One spiritual reference from a pastor or other ministry leader (not a family member), and one academic reference.

Short Answer Questions: During the application submission process, you will be asked to respond to some short answer questions in your application portal. These questions will help us get to know your character and career goals. Your file will not be reviewed for admission until your responses are received.

Writing Sample: Submit three or more pages of original writing that you would consider some of your best work.

Program Interview: After submitting your application materials including transcripts, a representative will contact you to schedule an interview.

International applicants must submit additional documentation including English Proficiency Score (TOEFL=minimum of 550 PBT or 79 iBT, IELTS=6.5), certified transcripts through an FPU approved service, copy of passport, visa information and a statement of financial support.
