OSF Student Leader Job Description

Summary:

Spiritual Formation Groups play a vital role in fostering spaces of belonging where students can safely grow in their faith together. A Spiritual Formation Group Leader is responsible for planning and facilitating meaningful discussions and events for students on campus. Leaders work in collaboration with Student Development Staff (primarily Spiritual Formation and/or Intercultural Learning Center).

- ★ Spiritual Formation Groups are spaces where students can find **a community that seeks to know and follow God together**. Our growth is fostered by studying scripture together, sharing testimonies, and going on spiritual formation retreats among many other things!
 - ★ Our leaders have a **heart for building community**, but first and foremost, have a **heart for Jesus**.
 - ★ Spiritual Formation Groups aim to **gather students around a shared identity or desire** to grow in faith together.

Key Responsibilities:

- Gather a group regularly to foster meaningful community and conversations
- Lead the group in spiritually formative practices and activities such as but not limited to:
 - Small group Bible study
 - Serving in the community
 - Retreats
 - Bringing in speakers
 - Prayer and meditation
 - Discipleship relationships
- Promote your SF Group and its events across campus through various channels such as flyers, announcements on The Scoop, and social media.
- Scan-in students on the Involve app at all events that are approved to receive Spiritual Formation credit (formerly called “College Hour” credit).
- Teams create a budget proposal and ministry plan to submit to OSF supervisor

Qualifications:

- Must have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Must have completed at least two academic semesters at FPU
- SF Group leaders may hold other leadership positions on campus but cannot hold a leadership position for multiple SF Groups at the same time

Qualities of an SF Group Leader:

- Strong leadership and interpersonal skills
- Commitment to fostering a positive and supportive community
- Effective communication and organizational skills
- Self-starter who can work both collaboratively and independently
- Loves and follows Jesus whole-heartedly!

Hours and Compensation:

- Semesterly stipend TBD upon budget approval
- 3-6 hours of work per week
